MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

After our WHS update last week we were advised that, as schools are not able to make decisions as to when to administer medication and how much, except in an emergency, we are unable to keep non-prescribed medication at school. If your child needs to take medication for a specific illness, the medication should be sent in to the school with a completed 'Request for support at school of a student's health condition' form. This will stay in place until the course of medication is complete.

If medication is needed for one day only, that medication should be sent in with a dated note which includes the following information;

- the students name
- name of medication
- dosage and time.

This medication will be sent home at the end of the school day.

We have attached a 'Request for support at school of a student's health condition' form which you will need to complete if your child needs to take a round of antibiotics.

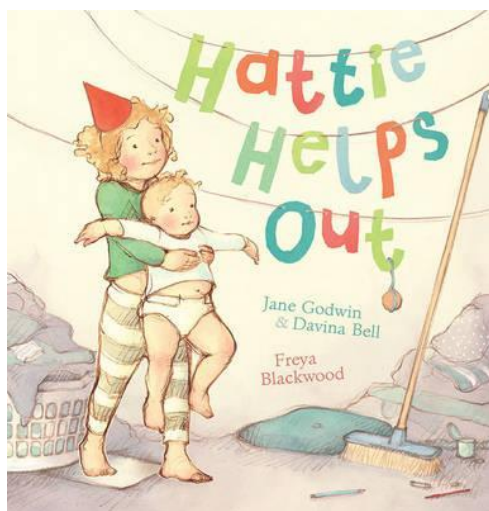

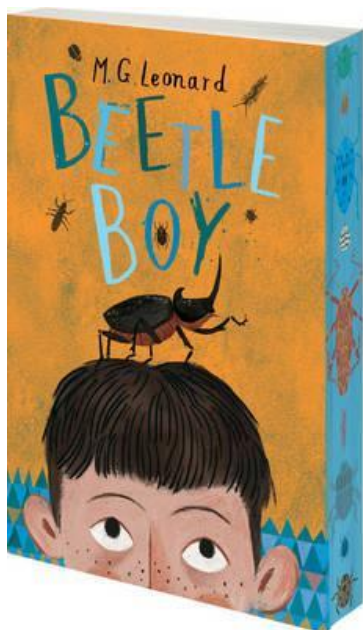
NEW BOOKS AT THE SCHOOL LIBRARY
