WHO CARES? A MOBILE APP FOR YOUNG CARERS

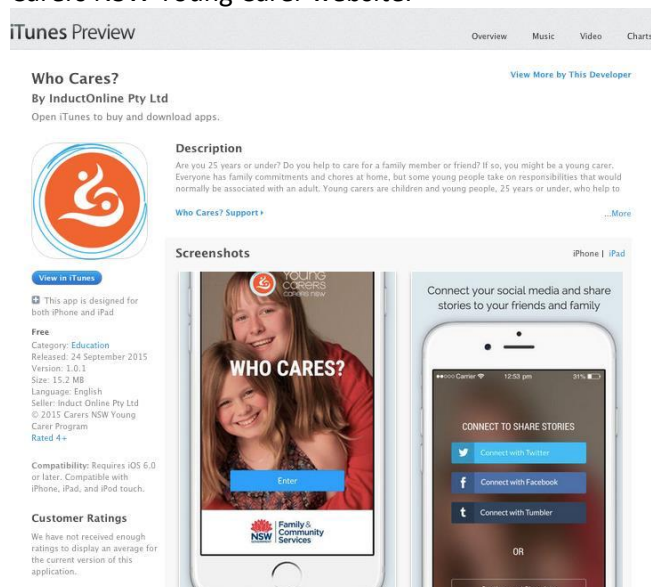
Did you know that over 100,000 carers in NSW are under 25 years of age?
