This afternoon we all enjoyed learning Toontastic via videoconference with Mrs Sansom. It is a great app that can be downloaded for FREE.

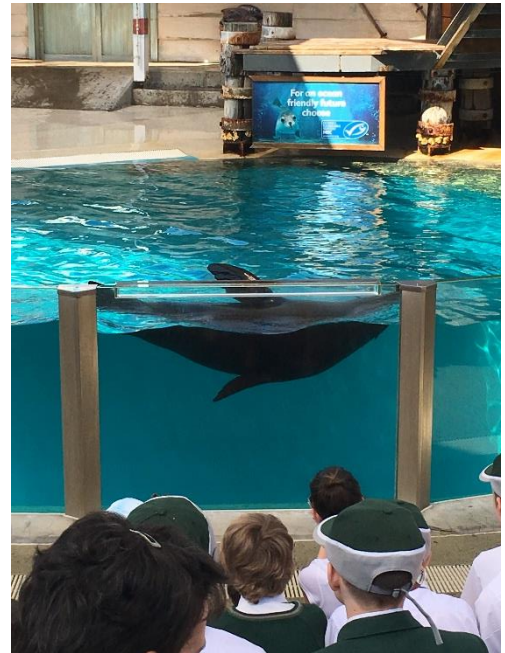
CAMP QUALITY VISIT

Thank you to the parents who sent in items for our cake stall. We raised \$152.00 for Camp Quality.



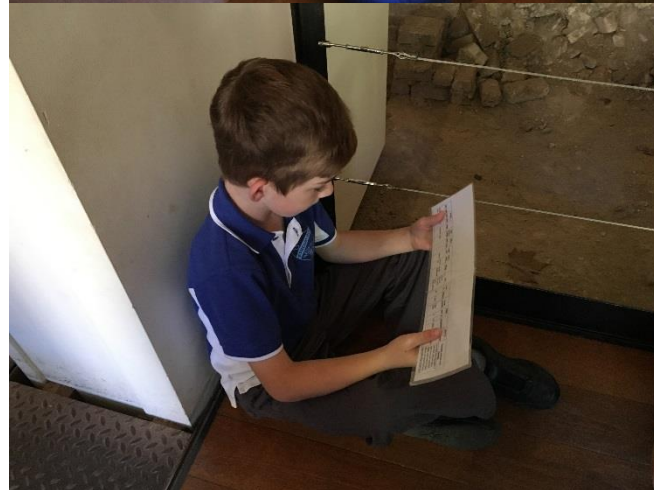


HOT LUNCH

ZOO SNOOZ EXCURSION

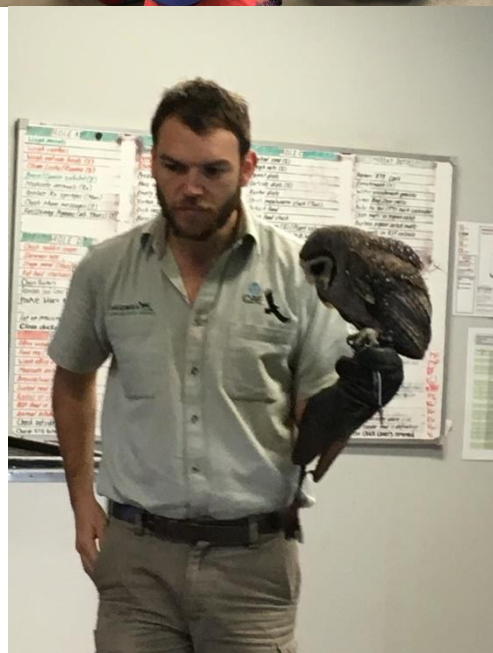
We had a fantastic time on the Zoo Snooz excursion last week.

Thank you for the notes and money that has been sent in for the Bathurst excursion.

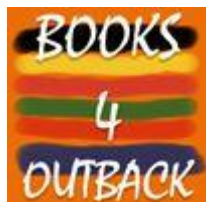
P&C MEETING
